OPEN SHOP: once a month during June, July and August. First session will be at Jay Stanley's shop in Belgrade, date and topic to be announced.




Special Executive Board Meeting Friday, April 28, 2017

The Executive Board met to discuss the possibility of the club hosting an expert turner remotely via a 2 way electronic connection. The presentation would be very much like watching a demonstration on the video display in a seminar room, and includes audio and video interaction with the presenter. The biggest advantage to the club is reduced cost—because the demonstrator doesn't have to travel, it will cost us less. The method is still quite new and we decided to let other folks work the bugs out and then we'll give it a try, hopefully early in 2018.

Since we will not be hosting a workshop this fall, the club will put on a one-day woodturning demonstration for the high school shop classes. We have done this previously and it worked out well. There will be 4 or 5 class periods and a different member usually presents each period. We will work with Mr. Brown in selecting a day.

We also plan to work with other Montana AAW chapters on demonstrations, possibly holding simultaneous video demos with one or both other clubs.

The green wood hands-on sessions have been well received and we decided we would like to have small group hands-on sessions more often in the future. To do this, we will arrange some "Open Shop" days when a member will open his or her shop to anyone interested in coming and everyone can work on a particular project, technique or problem. The hosts will need to be those with larger shops and we already have some volunteers. Open Shops will be once a month during the summer and we'll see how things go. If you have a shop that can hold at least 4 people and would like to host a session, or have a burning topic you want someone to cover, contact President Jay Stanley.
