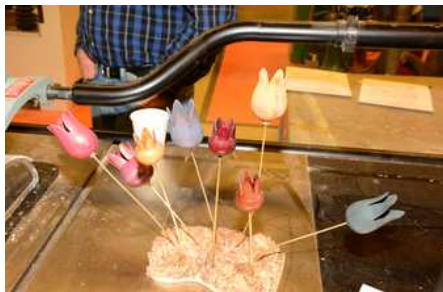

More Show N Tell



Turned and Carved Tulips by Jim Larson



1st.
TURN A Templet about 2 1/2" Long Tapered to 1/2" on small end, leave large end about 1 3/4".
USING A INDEXING wheel put 5 equal lines the length of the templet. This will be used for setting up the petals.



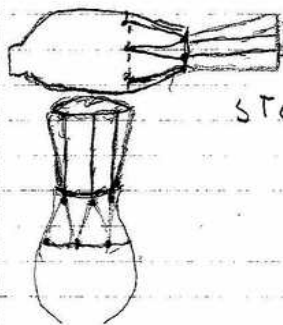
2. USING A BLANK 1 3/4" x 1 3/4" To 3" x 3" 4" Long
TURN THE BLANK BETWEEN CENTERS, CUTTING A TAPER ON ONE END. CHUCK UP THE BLANK AND SHAPE YOUR TULIP.



DRAW A LINE AROUND THE TULIP 3/4" FROM SMALL END

drill a hole through tulip just end of taper. I use a forester bit about 1/4" smaller than small end of tulip.

HOLLOW TULIP, AND SAND. INSERT TEMPLET IN TULIP, PUT A DOT ON END OF TULIP WHERE EACH LINE MEETS UP. PUT A DOT ON 3/4" LINE IN CENTER OF EACH OUTSIDE LINE, THESE WILL MAKE PETALS SHAPE.



CUT OUT PETALS, AND FINISH SANDING TULIP. CUT OFF OF LATHE, LEAVING NUBIN TO PUT STEM INTO.
