Creating and applying inlays—Jarred McDaniel

I apologize for not remembering to take snapshots during this extremely interesting talk. Jarred showed and told how he makes his own inlay materials using reasonably available chemicals. The resulting crystalline material can be made in many different colors, all of which are quite striking. There are some hazards associated with working with the often strong chemicals, so safety precautions are mandatory.

Jarred also discussed some of his methods and the challenges in applying the material and getting it to stay. He generally undercuts the edges of the defects he fills, in order to get the inlay material to stay. Here are a few photos of his inlays to show what you, too, could do.
